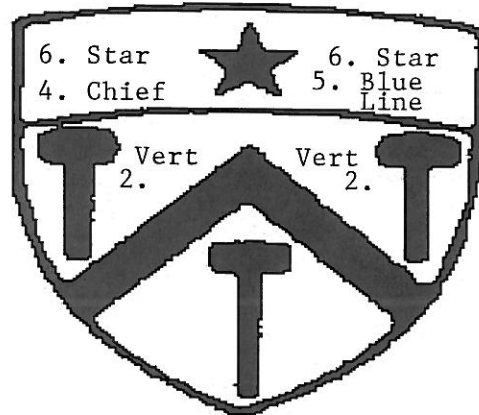

Sec. 2-3. Seal of the Town

The seal of the town shall state "Town of North Smithfield, State of Rhode Island and Providence Plantations." With the words "Incorporated 1871" in the center.

Sec. 2-4. Coat of Arms of the town.

In heraldic terms, the coat of arms of the town shall read: "North Smithfield. Vert a chevron between three smith's hammers argent, on a chief azure an etoile of the second."

DEFINITIONS

1. **COAT ARMOR**, or Surcoat. A loose garment worn over the armor of a knight; hence the term coat of arms. On this garment were emblazoned the armorial bearings of the wearer.
2. **Vert a Chevron**-Is a saw's tooth, arching from the middle of the left side of the shield to the middle of the right.
3. **Three Smith's Hammers Argent**-Argent is a French word for silver of which metal all white field or charges are supposed to consist. The shield bearing the three blacksmith hammers, that have come to represent the three villages of Greenville, Georgiaville and Esmond of Smithfield which North Smithfield was once part. North Smithfield separated from Smithfield and was established in 1871 and North Smithfield kept the three blacksmith hammers as their logo.
4. **Chief** means one of the honorable ordinaries and it is placed on the upper part of the shield and contains a third part of it.
5. **Azure** is the French word for blue. It is distinguished in heraldic engraving by lines running parallel to each other in an horizontal direction.
6. An **etoile** is a French word for a star.
